




TOPSFIELD HISTORICAL COMMISSION

The Topsfield Historical Commission is pleased to announce a way for you to acquire an HISTORIC HOUSE MARKER for your home or historic property.



Markers and signboards have long been used to express historical distinction on houses throughout the United States. Topsfield has a rich history of people and houses, barns and outbuildings, but many of our Town's treasures are unmarked!

The Commission encourages homeowners of properties built prior to 1950, and especially owners of properties listed in the Town's Inventory, to apply for a Historic Marker. In addition to identifying your house to the public, it will help the Town compile a comprehensive list of our Town's historic structures.

Specifications

Size is 12"x 16", made of MDO weatherproof signboard, finished with 3 coats of special sign painter's oil based primer and enamel topcoat. Holes are predrilled and screws are provided. Space is provided for up to four lines of copy with white background color and black letters, all hand-painted.

Please enclose a check payable to **Ould Colony Artisans** in the amount of \$65, which includes shipping and handling, and mail to the Historical Commission House Marker Program, 8 West Common Street, Topsfield, or drop it off at Town Hall.
