Don't You Become the Gift This Holiday Season.

Please be aware of these numerous scams during the holidays:

• Charities

They call with wonderful requests for money to help a worthy cause. All they want is your credit card information so they can buy gifts on your credit card. No matter how worthy the pitch sounds, tell them you will check them out first and then make a decision. (They will probably hang up)

Don't give out any credit card, other financial information. or social security numbers .

• Fake Retailer Web Sites

The site looks real. The products look real. The site may be a fake.

Look over the site with care. Misspellings, incorrect grammar and the like are red flag that it may be a fake site. Buy from trusted names. If you decide to buy, use your credit card not your debit card. If a problem, it is often easier to contest the charge when it is on a credit card.

Media

Be aware of raffles and giveaways. If the "gift" seems too good to be true, it probably is.

I am Stranded. I need Money to get Home

This scam lives on, especially during the Holidays.

A relative calls asking for money to get home. Don't tell the parents.

If you have been contacted by any of these:

Call a relative, a trusted friend or Detective Sergeant Gary Hayward at the Topsfield Police at 978-887-6533. (When prompted, press 0 and ask for Detective Sergeant Gary Hayward.) Don't be afraid to talk about what has happened to you. You are not alone; it has happened to many.
