SENIOR HOMEOWNERS & RENTERS!

YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR CASH or CREDIT FROM THE STATE
IF YOU PAY RENT OR PROPERTY TAXES!

The Massachusetts "CIRCUIT BREAKER" TAX PROGRAM is for people who meet the following criteria:

- 1. Aged 65 or older.
- 2. Property taxes combined with water and sewer charges exceed 10% (or rent exceeds 25%) of income.
- 3. Own or rent primary residence in Massachusetts.
- 4. Do not receive subsidized housing.
- 5. Assessed value of owned home does not exceed \$705,000 on January
- 1, 2012.
- 6. Income does not exceed \$53,000 for individuals or \$80,000 for couples.

If you meet the above criteria you are most likely due a "refund" check from the Dept. of Revenue for this year and the past 3 years EVEN IF YOU DON'T NORMALLY FILE STATE TAXES! The maximum credit you may receive for: 2012 is \$1,000, 2011 is \$980, 2010 is \$970, and 2009 is \$960.
