If a property/project is the subject of an Order of Conditions, Enforcement Order, or other Commission matters, the Commission may receive information and make decisions as necessary to address concerns and/or to protect the interests of the Wetlands Protection Act, the Topsfield General Wetlands Bylaw, and other Laws the Commission is authorized to uphold.

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In accordance with Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act Regulations, 310 CMR 10.00, in order to show standing as a basis for an adjudicatory appeal, ten-citizen groups, aggrieved persons, and abutters need proof of prior participation (a person(s) needs to have submitted written comments during the hearing process).
