



Tips from the Fire Department

Is Your Number Up?

Please help us in making sure your Home Street Number is visible from the street!

- Massachusetts General Law (CH.148s59) and our local ordinance require that all buildings have a street number that can be seen from the road.
- Street numbers are vital so that Emergency Responders can locate your home quickly.
- Recommended 4", block style, contrasting color placed on dwelling in plain view. It is not recommended that the number be placed on doors. Numbers, not letters, should be placed above or beside the door. Numbers should also be reflective.

- Caulk and weather-strip doors and windows that leak air.
- When home, turn down the heat to 68° F or as low as comfortable.
- When you are asleep or away from home, turn thermostat back 7° to 10° for eight hours and save as much as 10% a year on your heating and cooling bills.
- Consider getting a programmable thermostat.
- Turn down the temperature of your hot water heater to 120°.
- Have your oil-fired heating system serviced annually or your gas-fired heating system serviced every three years.
- Clean or replace furnace filters every other month.
- Keep the fireplace flue damper closed unless a fire is burning.
- Check that warm air registers, baseboard heaters and radiators are not blocked by furniture or drapes. · Close your curtains and shades at night; open them during the day.


